# Scrappy Trip Around the World Supply List 

## Basic Sewing Kit:

Thread - machine piecing thread in a neutral shade to match your fabrics
Fabric shears
Thread snips or scissors
Seam ripper (important tool for this technique - don't forget to bring!)
Straight pins
Sewing machine in working order

## Rotary Cutting Supplies:

- Rotary Mat, at least 18 " square
- Acrylic ruler, at least 2-1/2" x 18 "
- Rotary Cutter with a fresh blade


## Fabric:

Bring an assortment of $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $16^{\prime \prime}$ strips. You will need 6 strips per block, resulting in a 12 finished block. A jelly roll works nicely for this project; or you may wish to cut an assortment of strips from your stash, or a combination!

You can make this quilt in any size you wish. See the chart on the following page for how many strips/Jelly Rolls you will need.

## Scrappy Trip Around the World Reference Chart

| Size | Measurement* | Number <br> of Blocks | Total Number <br> of Strips <br> Needed** | Number of <br> Jelly Rolls <br> Needed*** |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| Baby | $36 \times 36^{\prime \prime}(3 \times 3$ blocks $)$ | 9 | 54 | 1 |
| Crib | $36 \times 48^{\prime \prime}(3 \times 4$ blocks $)$ | 12 | 72 | 1 |
| Lap | $60 \times 72^{\prime \prime}(5 \times 6$ blocks $)$ | 30 | 180 | 3 |
| Square Lap | $72 \times 72^{\prime \prime}(6 \times 6$ blocks $)$ | 36 | 216 | 3 |
| Twin | $72 \times 84^{\prime \prime}(6 \times 7$ blocks $)$ | 42 | 252 | 4 |
| Queen | $84 \times 96^{\prime \prime}(7 \times 8$ blocks $)$ | 56 | 336 | 5 |
| King | $96 \times 108^{\prime \prime}(8 \times 9$ blocks $)$ | 72 | 432 | 6 |

* Finished block measures 12 ".
**Each strip measures $2-1 / 2 " \times 16 "$; you will need six strips per block.
***Depending on what size you are making, you can supplement with yardage or stash instead of buying as many Jelly Rolls as called for.

One Jelly Roll strip yields two 16 " strips.
A fat quarter yields seven 16 " strips.
