

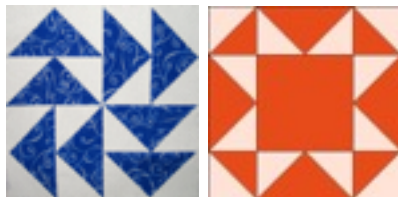

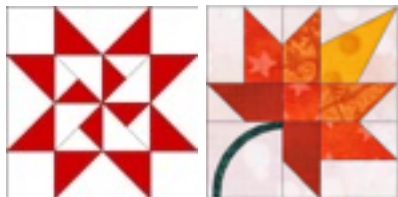

### 1-301 Wing Clipper, Pickets and Quickets -



Put your flying geese on the right track by pointing them in the correct direction. Learn the simple secrets to creating crisp, clean units effectively and quickly. This method can be applied to any pattern that requires flying geese units. Since you usually have to make hundreds of these units at a time, why not make them perfect every time?



Expand the use of your Wing Clipper 1 by learning how to make Pickets and Quickets. Once you begin to recognize these units, you will be surprised how often they appear in patterns from your favorite magazines and designers. You will want to add Pickets and Quickets to your border options.

**\*Required tools:** Wing Clipper I and Quilter's Magic Wand (or other 1/4" seam guide) These can be purchased at the Old Country Store

#### Basic Sewing Supplies -

- Sewing Machine with a new needle, power cords and manual (just in case)
  - Thread - 50 wt is good for piecing
  - Snips or trimming scissors
  - Seam ripper
  - Extra fine Pins
- A list of your Studio 180 (Deb Tucker) tools

#### Basic Quilting Supplies:

- Rotary Cutter with a sharp blade
- Marking pen or pencil - (frixon pen or mechanical pencil)
- Small cutting mat
- Straight edge ruler 6"x12" or so
- Invisigrip or true grips highly recommended for the back of wing clipper
- Best Press or light starch (optional)

**Fabric Requirements:** For course 1-301, we recommend the following yardage: these are approximations or you can use your left over fabric from the last classes.

1/4 yard Focal Fabric

1/3 yard Background (light)

1/4 yard of a coordinating or contrasting fabric with the focal fabric

## CUTTING CHARTS for 2" x 4" Finished Units

**When choosing colors for flying geese the large square will be the center of your geese and the small squares are the side triangles.**

Cutting for Flying Geese Units	
Large Squares	Cut 2 - 5 1/2" squares (1 square background fabric & 1 focal fabric)
Small Squares	Cut 8 - 3" squares (4 squares focal fabric & 4 background fabric)

For Mirror Image Units
Cut (2) 5 1/2" Large Squares
Cut (4) 3" Small Squares - Color #1
Cut (4) 3" Small Squares - Color #2

For a Scrapper Look
Cut (1) 5 1/2" Large Square
Cut (4) 3" Small Squares in 4 different colors

Cutting for Picket Fence (Picket Method)
Rectangles - Cut (4) 2 3/4" x 4 3/4"
Squares - Cut (4) 2 3/4" squares

Cutting for Picket Fence (Quickets Method)
Large Square - Cut (4) 5 1/2" squares
Small Squares - Cut (4) 3" squares

Separate each unit's fabric into a ziplock bag and label.
