## Poinsettia Stars <br> Student Supply List

## Pattern:

Poinsettia Stars quilt pattern by Planted Seed Designs. The pattern is currently only available in PDF format, unless you can locate a paper copy from another seller. Use this link to order directly from Planted Seed Designs.

## Basic Sewing Kit:

Fabric Shears
Patchwork pins
Thread snips
Seam ripper
Machine piecing thread in a neutral color to match your fabrics

## Half Square Triangle Rulers:

I will be demonstrating two ruler options the day of class. Feel free to wait until after the class demonstration to make your purchase.

- Quilters Select square rulers:
- $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " square ruler or larger, OR
- One $41 / 2 "$ ruler and one $21 / 2$ " ruler (Having both sizes is ideal, but feel free to wait until the day of class to purchase both rulers if you aren't sure you're ready to commit to buying two.)
- BlocLoc ruler(s):
- $41 / 2$ " ruler or larger, OR
- One $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " ruler and one $21 / 2$ " ruler (Again, having both sizes is ideal, but feel free to wait until the day of class to purchase both rulers if you aren't sure you're ready to commit to buying two.)


## Rotary Cutting Supplies:

- Rotary cutter with fresh blade
- Acrylic rulers; I like the following sizes:
- 6 " $\times 24$ "
- 4 " $\times 14^{\prime \prime}$
- Cutting mat: 18 " $\times 24$ " is a good size


## Additional Supplies:

- Spray starch, Best Press, Flatter, or your favorite starch alternative
- Frixion pen or fine marking pencil
- $1 / 2$ " marking ruler:
- Creative Grids 15 " Seam Guide Tool, OR
- Fons and Porter $1 / 4$ " Seam Marker, OR
- Studio 180 Quilters Magic Wand, OR
- Omnigrid 4", 6", and 12" Marking Ruler Trio


## Optional Supplies:

- Fork pins
- Wooly Felted Wonders Pressing Bar and Clapper, or The Strip Stick (for pressing seams open)
- Wooden Tailor's clapper
- Rotating cutting mat, or a small $6 \times 8$ " cutting mat works well too.
- Mini Design Boards, $20 \times 20$ ". If you're not familiar with Lori Holt's Mini Design Boards, click here for the video on how to make them. No need to add the binding around the edges; they hold up just fine without it.
- Clover Tailors Awl


## Sewing Machine, etc.:

- Sewing machine in working order
- $1 / 4$ " patchwork foot, if you have
- Sewing machine needles, size $80 / 12$ sharp or universal


## Fabric Requirements:

Important! Since we will be trimming down the half-square triangle units, we will be starting with larger squares. As a result, you will need a bit more fabric than what the pattern calls for. You can make this quilt any size you want, or just stitch a few blocks for a table runner!

Please use the following yardage amounts instead referring to the pattern. Finished block measures 16".
$68 \times 68$ " quilt ( 16 blocks), as shown on pattern:

- Accent fabric (I used 8 different reds): $1 / 2$ yard of each. *Note: this is a tight fit with no room for cutting mistakes, so you may want to purchase $5 / 8$ yard of each just to be safe. Or, you can use 16 different fat quarters or $1 / 4$ yard cuts.
- Background fabric: 4 yards


## Yardage per block:

- Accent fabric: $1 / 4$ yard or 1 fat quarter
- Background fabric: $1 / 4$ yard or 1 fat quarter
*Again, this is a tight fit with no room for cutting mistakes, so you may want to purchase $3 / 8$ yard of each fabric instead of $1 / 4$ yard.


## ***Important***

Feel free to cut your squares ahead of time, but keep in mind you will be cutting the larger squares $51 / 4 "$ instead of $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$, and the smaller squares $31 / 4 "$ instead of $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ as instructed in the pattern.
