# Meadowland Quilt <br> Student Supply List 

## Pattern:

Meadowland Quilt by Meghan Buchanan of Then Came June

## Basic Sewing Kit:

- Fabric Shears
- Patchwork pins
- Thread snips
- Seam ripper
- Machine piecing thread in a neutral color to match your fabrics


## Rotary Cutting Supplies:

- Wing Clipper Ruler by Studio 180
- Omnigrid Invisigrip (cling film to prevent ruler from slipping)
- Rotary cutter with fresh blade
- Acrylic rulers; I like the following sizes:
- 6 " x 24 "
- 4 " $\times 14^{\prime \prime}$
- Cutting mat: $18^{\prime \prime} \times 24^{\prime \prime}$ is a good size


## Additional Supplies:

- Frixion pen or fine tip marking pencil
- $1 / 2 "$ marking ruler:
- Creative Grids 15 " Seam Guide Tool, OR
- Fons and Porter $1 / 4$ " Seam Marker, OR
- Studio 180 Quilters Magic Wand, OR
- Omnigrid 4", 6", and 12" Marking Ruler Trio


## Optional Supplies:

- Wooly Felted Wonders Pressing Bar and Clapper (the 12 " size is sufficient), OR The Strip Stick (Both items will allow you to press seams open more easily.)
- Spray starch, Best Press, Flatter, or your favorite starch alternative
- Clover Tailor's Awl
- Sandpaper board or a sheet of fine sand paper


## Sewing Machine, etc.:

- Sewing machine in working order
- $1 / 4$ " patchwork foot, if you have
- Sewing machine needles, size $80 / 12$ sharp or universal

| Binding | $1 / 2 \mathrm{yd}$ | $1 / 2 \mathrm{yd}$ | 1/2 yd | 2/3 yd | $2 / 3 \mathrm{yd}$ | 2/3 yd |
| Batting | $52^{\prime \prime} \times 52^{\prime \prime}$ | $52^{\prime \prime} \times 68{ }^{\prime \prime}$ | $68^{\prime \prime} \times 68^{\prime \prime}$ | $68^{\prime \prime} \times 84^{\prime \prime}$ | $84^{\prime \prime} \times 84^{\prime \prime}$ | $84^{\prime \prime} \times 100^{\prime \prime}$ |
| Layout | $3 \times 3$ <br> 9 blocks | $3 \times 4$ <br> 12 blocks | $4 \times 4$ <br> 16 blocks | $\begin{gathered} 4 \times 5 \\ 20 \text { blocks } \end{gathered}$ | $\begin{gathered} 5 \times 5 \\ 25 \text { blocks } \end{gathered}$ | $\begin{gathered} 5 \times 6 \\ 30 \text { blocks } \end{gathered}$ |

*Note: $1 / 4$ yard cuts MAY NOT work in place of fat quarters unless they were cut generously; you need enough yardage to cut a $9-1 / 2$ " square.

Also, please refer to the attached cutting diagram; students found it to be easier than the cutting diagram in the pattern.

## ***Important***

Feel free to cut your fabric ahead of time following the pattern instructions, but keep in mind if you wish to use the Wing Clipper Ruler, you'll need to cut your squares a bit larger than the pattern directs:
$1-\mathbf{9 - 1 / 2}$ " square (instead of $9-1 / 4$ ")
$4-\mathbf{5}$ " squares (instead of $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ )
We'll be discussing fabric selection in depth, so you may want to wait until after the class lecture to purchase the rest of your fabrics. You'll need at least three different fabrics to complete a block in class.
