Basic Sewing Kit:

- Fabric Shears
- Patchwork pins
- Thread snips
- Seam ripper
- Machine piecing thread in a neutral color to match your fabrics

Rotary Cutting Supplies:

- Wing Clipper Ruler by Studio 180
- Omnigrid Invisigrip (cling film to prevent ruler from slipping)
- Bloc Loc Half Square Triangle Ruler, 5-1/2" or larger, OR 5-1/2" or larger square ruler with a diagonal 45 degree line
- Rotary cutter with fresh blade
- Acrylic rulers; I like the following sizes:
 - o 6" x 24"
 - o 4" x 14"
- Cutting mat: 18" x 24" is a good size

Additional Supplies:

- Frixion pen or fine tip marking pencil
- ½" marking ruler:
 - o Creative Grids 15" Seam Guide Tool (my favorite), **OR**
 - o Fons and Porter 1/4" Seam Marker, **OR**
 - o Studio 180 Quilters Magic Wand, **OR**
 - o Omnigrid 4", 6", and 12" Marking Ruler Trio

Optional Supplies:

- Wooly Felted Wonders Pressing Bar and Clapper (the 12" size is sufficient), OR The Strip Stick (Both items will allow you to press seams open more easily.)
- Spray starch, Best Press, Flatter, or your favorite starch alternative
- Tailor's clapper
- Clover Tailor's Awl
- Sandpaper board or a sheet of fine sandpaper
- Rotating cutting mat

Sewing Machine, etc.:

- Sewing machine in working order
- 1/4" patchwork foot, if you have
- Sewing machine needles, size 80/12 sharp or universal

Tips on choosing fabrics (we'll cover this in class in depth):

- Use a collection of fat quarters by a designer
- Use a curated bundle from a quilt shop
- Choose your backing fabric, then select coordinating fabrics (my favorite fail-proof method!)
- Choose 2-3 colors, then select fabrics in various shades of those colors
- Or, make it super scrapy! I find it works best to have some sort of color palate to work with to keep it from feeling too chaotic.

If you are comfortable cutting, go ahead and cut all your fabrics prior to class following the instructions in the pattern. If you are using directional prints, or would prefer some guidance on cutting, feel free to wait and do your cutting in class.

Also, if you have never made flying geese and/or half square triangles before, you may want to bring some scrap fabrics along to make a test block to work out any kinks instead of using the fabrics you have selected for your quilt.
