

Modern Hexie Stocking Student Supply List

Pattern: *Hexie Pillow* pattern by Nicole Daksiewicz of Modern Handcraft

Modern Hexie Supplies:

- Mini Charm Pack of fabric, or 34 - 40 2.5" x 2.5" squares of fabric for hexies
- 1" hexagon paper templates (34 - 40), or download the hexagon pattern PDF from the *Hexie Pillow* pattern, then print onto cardstock, and cut out.
- Fat quarters:
 - One fat quarter for the outside of your stocking (front and back). If you want a different fabric for the back of your stocking, choose an additional FQ.
 - One fat quarter for the lining of your stocking
- 20" square of low loft cotton batting
- 6" length of rickrack for stocking hanger (optional)
- Paper hole punch
- Clover Wonder Clips
- Hand stitching thread (I like to use a hand quilting weight thread.)
- Hand stitching needles (I prefer Milliner/Straw needles, size 9.)
- Thimble, if you use one (I love Clover's Protect and Grip Thimbles.)
- Best Press, or your favorite spray starch or starch alternative
- Roxanne Glue-Baste-It with a fine point
- Clover Hera Marker
- Chaco Liner (optional)

Rotary Cutting Supplies:

- Rotary cutter with a fresh blade
- Cutting mat
- 24" acrylic ruler
- 1" acrylic hexagon fabric cutting template - be sure to select one with a 3/8" seam allowance instead of 1/4". The Mini Hexagon Jelly Roll Ruler by EZ Quilting works perfectly for the size of paper pieces we will be using.

Basic Sewing Kit:

- Fabric Shears
- Pins
- Seam ripper
- Thread snips or small scissors

Sewing Machine and Machine Quilting Supplies:

- Sewing machine in working order
- Walking foot if your machine does not have a dual feed feature
- Machine quilting thread - I like Aurifil 50 wt cotton.

- Sewing machine needles: I like to use a 90/14 Topstitch needle for machine quilting.
- Small safety pins for basting

If you would like to get a head start on your project, you can go ahead prepare you hexies by wrapping the fabric around the paper shapes and tacking them as demonstrated in my YouTube video:
