

Redwood Tote Supply List

- Cutting Mat (I like to use 18x24)
- Rotary cutter
- Long Ruler (I like to use 6 x 24)
- Small square ruler (I like to use 4.5" square)
- Pins
- Clips
- Seam Ripper
- Fabric scissors
- Fabric glue
- Stiletto
- Tailors Chalk (if using dark fabrics)
- Disappearing ink pen for marking on fabric
- Sewing machine
- Regular sewing foot attachment for the sewing machine
- Zipper foot attachment for the sewing machine
- Sewing needle 90/14 is recommended if using thicker materials such as canvas.
- Redwood Tote Pattern by Noodlehead
- Fabric and Interfacing Requirements listed on the back of the pattern
 - The pattern recommends canvas, but I use canvas, linen or quilting cottons for this bag.
 - I would recommend reading through the pattern before choosing and purchasing the fabric. You may want to purchase a little more than the recommended fabric if the fabric is directional or if you want to showcase the accent fabric on a different section of the bag.
 - For interfacing you will need Pellon SF 101 and Pellon 72F. This bag has some thick spots to sew through so I would recommend using only with the interfacing listed in the pattern.
- Bag Hardware and Zippers listed on the back of the pattern (I like to use Sallie Tomato Hardware kits and also their #5 nylon teeth zippers by the yard.) Sallie Tomato Level 3 Basic 1" Kit
 - If you choose to use metal zippers on this bag, you will want to purchase the exact zipper length listed in the pattern. They should be closed ended zippers and not separating jacket zippers.
- Note: If you want to do leather handles, you will need 2 – ¾" wide 15" long pieces of leather
 - In order to set adhere the leather handles, you will also need some medium rivets and rivet setting tool and punch, and a hammer
- Note: If you want to do cork handles, you will need two strips 15" long by 1 ½" wide
- Note: You can also use a 1" cotton webbing for the crossbody strap if you want to instead of sewing a fabric strap . If you would like to use webbing, you will need approximately 1 ½ yds.

Before Class:

In order to ensure we have time to get through all of the important techniques in this pattern, all of the fabric should be cut and interfacing adhered before the beginning of class. Noodlehead provides

cutting instructions in the beginning of the pattern with a layout to show how to maximize the cuts of the fabric and interfacing.
