

During this 4 part class you will take Dori Poulsen's pattern Seaside Sail and "Create a One-of-a-Kind Quilt" by choosing your own embroidery/applique blocks. You will also learn how to Tuckerize the pieced blocks using Studio 180 Design - Deb Tucker's Wing Clipper. This is your quilt so let your creative juices run and if you feel like you are not creative but would love help to step out of your comfort zone we will help you accomplish a beautiful quilt you will be proud of. Quilt size is 54 " x 70 ".

- Pattern: Seaside Sail by Dodi Poulsen - You can find the pattern on esty.com (We will use the pattern as a template to design your One-of-a Kind Quilt and Tuckerize the pieced blocks. Due to copyright issues you need to purchase the pattern)
- Studio 180 Design - Wing Clipper and Instructions for tool (available at the Old Country Store)
- Magic Wand or another $1 / 4$ " seam guide (available at the Old Country Store)
- Paper for taking notes


## Supply List for Embroidery/Applique Blocks:

Embroidery Designs to be purchased online.

- This is a custom class. Please find a collection of embroidery designs that you love.
- Examples of embroidery designs are: Birds, Flowers, Kids, Seasonal themes, etc.

## Stabilizer

- Medium tear away stabilizer - We used OESD - I recommend bringing your roll.
- Light tear away stabilizer - We used OESD - I recommend bringing your roll.
- Hydro stick stabilizer 10 " wide - We used OESD - I recommend bringing your roll.

Thread

- Bring a variety of embroidery threads including all the colors needed for your embroidery and applique designs. We will start using these threads in April.

Bobbin Thread: - Seraline - please have bobbin thread prewound
Needles: - We recommend the Microtex 90/14.
Spray Adhesive: 505 preferred
Embroidery Machine: - bring your machine with table, module, cords, foot control, manual etc.
Feet: - \#26 (embroidery foot) 97, 97C, or 97D
Hoop: - Medium hoop, large hoop or midi hoop
Stitch plate: Single hole 0 mm (if you have it) or regular 9 mm
Other:

- Small old towel or drop cloth
- Thread snips
- Small and large ruler
- Flash drive with downloaded designs
- Straight pins
- Fabric scissors
- Temporary Marker or pencil
- Tweezers
- Press cloth
- Rotary cutter
- Paper scissors
- Seam ripper

Basic Sewing and Quilting Supplies for Pieced Blocks and quilt construction:

- Sewing Machine with a new needle, power cords and manual (just in case)
- Thread - 50 wt is good for piecing
- Seam ripper
- Scissor snips
- Extra fine pins - Clover Patchwork Extra Fine Pins Or Magic Pins - extra fine
- Small cutting mat - $12^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ or larger

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

| Fabric | Yardage |
| :--- | :---: |
| Background - (for pieced blocks and embroidery/ $15 / 8 \mathrm{yds}$ <br> applique blocks) <br> Borders - (Inner Borders, Center Sashing and Star Flying <br> Geese points) $11 / 4 \mathrm{yds}$ <br> Star Blocks  |  |
| Pinwheel Star Blocks <br> (3 Prints) | 1 fat quarter of 3 different prints |
| Outer Border | $11 / 4 \mathrm{yds}$ |
| Binding | $1 / 2 \mathrm{yd}$ |
| Backing | $31 / 4 \mathrm{yds}$ |

## CUTTING DIRECTIONS for March's Class



|  | STAR BLOCK |
| :---: | :---: |
| Center Squares | Cut total of 10-4 1/2" $\times 4$ 1/2" squares from 3 fat quarters |
| Background fabric for center of Flying Geese | Cut 2 strips - $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF - subcut into $10-51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares (use remnant for Corner Squares above) |
| Points for Flying Geese - from Border/Sashing fabric | Cut $31 / 2$ strips - $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF - subcut into $40-3^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{\prime \prime}$ squares |
| Corners - from background fabric | Cut 2 strips - $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF + remnant from 5 1/2" background strip from flying geese - subcut into $40-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares |

During our 1st class we will discuss the layout of your quilt, how to Tuckerize and construct the Star Block and discuss embroidery stabilizers and how to hoop your design.
