**The completed Mug Rug will be approximately 8 ½" x 10 ½". Dimensions will vary among the group.**

### To be purchased online.

- Welcome to our artistic adventure! Please find a font that you love and bring it to class on your flash drive. Don't like the thought of putting a font in the middle of your design, no worries. Find a design you love and bring that with you on your flash drive. Just ensure that your selected font or design is a snug 2"x 2" ensuring a perfect fit within the heart of your circle creation.
- Just for reference I used the below font and added a cute little bee. Please keep in mind when we add your design into your machines it is recommended not to decrease the size of your design more than 20%.

***Also, please bring your color change sheet from Embroidery Online to use for guidance with your color choice and assembly.***

*If you have time in class, you are welcome to start a second Mug Rug.*

### Fabric

- Fabric needed: Please see mug rug picture for guidance
  - Mug Rug measures 8 ½" x 10 ½"
  - I choose all my fabrics from my stash
    - One color for circle and binding – I used dark red approximately 20" x 20"
    - One color for front background – I used a cream color approximately 16" x 12"
    - One color for the backing and flange – I used a cream with small roses approximately 20" x 20"
    - One color for the embroidery design to be stitched on. – I used white approximately 10" x 10"
    - Assorted items to be cut out from fabric to adhere on project. – I choose several fabrics that had different flowers on them. Keeping in mind that I wanted light, medium, and dark tones.
    - You will need batting for your mug rug. – I used scrap batting. About 20" x 20"
      - Please note these are only suggestions as scraps are sometimes smaller and larger pieces. You will be preparing your fabric in class. No need to prep at home. 😊

### Stabilizer

- Light tear away stabilizer – I used OESD – I recommend bringing your roll.
- Medium tear away stabilizer – I used OESD – I recommend bringing your roll.
- Fusible Woven stabilizer – I used OESD – I recommend bringing your roll.
- Fuse and Seal specialty stabilizer – I used OESD – I recommend using the 8" x 10" sheets.

### Thread

- Bring a variety of threads including all the colors needed for the completion of your Mug Rug. Refer to your chosen Mug Rug design color chart for suggested colors. But please use your own creative flow when choosing your colors.

**Bobbin Thread:**

- Seraline – please have bobbin thread prewound

**Bobbin Case:**

- If you have a yellow bobbin case it is highly recommended that you bring this to class.
- You will also be using your black bobbin case for the sewing portion of this project.

**Needles: -**

- Microtex 80/12

**Spray Adhesive:** 505 preferred**Embroidery Machine:** – bring your machine, module, cords foot control, etc.

- **Feet:** - #26 (embroidery foot)
- **Feet:** - # 97, 97C, 97D (1/4 inch foot) 10, 10C, 10D (Edge Stitch Foot)

**Hoop:** - Medium Hoop – I used for the embroidery letter on white fabric

Large Hoop – I used to add the circle around my embroidered design

**Stitch plate:** Single hole 0mm (if you have it) or regular 9mm**Other:**

Small old towel or drop cloth

Temporary Marker or pencil

Thread snips

Tweezers

small and large ruler

paper scissors

Flash drive to load projects

rotary cutter

Straight pins

small applique scissors

Fabric scissors

seam ripper

Your machine manual

press cloth

Paper for taking notes
