Supply list:







The Holiday Placemat project will result in a charming piece measureing around 14" x 18". Keep in mind that sizes may differ slightly based on individual work. This class is tailored for those with intermediate to advanced skills. If you're new to embroidery and quilting, don't worry! Just reach out to me before class begins so we can go over the techniques involved. Understanding these will help you make progess on the project during our time together, even if it's not completed within the class period.

Please be aware that there's some pre-class preparation required. Below, I've outlined the details for you.

To be purchased online.

- Please purchase one of the following from Embroidery Library
 - o Ballerina
 - Marvels of Christmas Ballerina (emblibrary.com)
 - o Reindeer
 - Marvels of Christmas Reindeer (emblibrary.com)
 - Nutcracker
 - Marvels of Christmas Nutcracker (emblibrary.com)
- Copy/paste the highlighted blue into Embroidery Library webpage and the designs I used will show.

Also, please bring your color change sheet from Embroidery Library to use for guidance with your color choice and assembly.

Optional purchase.

• For the ribbon on the right side of the placemat. If you choose to not use my digitized option, you can purchase a ribbon of your choice to stitch on your placemat, or you can leave it off.

Fabric

- Fabric needed: Please see placemat picture for guidance
 - Placemat measures 14" x 18"
 - This will need to be cut to size before coming to class (*Prepping required*)
 - I used canvas fabric for the front of my placemat and cotton fabric for the back.
 You can choose any kind of fabric you prefer.
 - One color for front I used a cream color cut at 16" x 20"
 - One color for the backing—I used burgundy cut at 18" x 22"
 - One "ribbon" cut at 2 ¼" x 14"
 - Use Misty Fuse or another fusible interfacing on the back of the ribbon. Add the fusible interfacing before coming to class.
 - Batting cut at 17" x 19"

- Bias Binding Cut WOF at 2 ½" and ironed in half lengthwise
 - You will need approximately 72" to complete the binding. This
 measurement gives you some play room.

Stabilizer

- Light tear away stabilizer I used OESD I recommend bringing your roll.
- Medium tear away stabilizer I used OESD I recommend bringing your roll.

Additional Options

- Lite Steam-A-Seam2 Can be purchased at the Old Country Store
- Honeysew Diagonal Seam Tapes Can be purchased at the Old Country Store
- Thread Stand for embroidery and sewing Can be purchased at the Old Country Store
 - If you don't have a tread stand you can use a bowl sitting on the table behind your machine. This is a must use when sewing with metallic thread.
- Quilter's Cut n Press (optional) Can be purchased at the Old Country Store

Thread

- Bring a variety of threads including all the colors needed for the completion of your Placemat.
 Refer to your chosen Placemat design color chart for suggested colors. But please use your own creative flow when choosing your colors.
- You will need to have a thread color to match your back fabric when guilting.
- You will need to have a tread color for quilting the top of your placemat.

Bobbin Thread:

Seraline – please have bobbin thread prewound

Bobbin Case:

- If you have a yellow bobbin case it is highly recommended that you bring this to class.
- You will also be using your black bobbin case for the sewing portion of this project.

Needles: -

- Schmetz Microtex 80/12
- Schmetz Metallic 80/12

Spray Adhesive: 505 preferred

Embroidery Machine: – bring your machine, module, cords foot control, etc.

- Feet: #26 (embroidery foot)
- **Feet:** # 97, 97C, 97D (1/4 inch foot)
- Feet: #10, 10C, 10D (Edge Stitch Foot) optional
- Feet: #20, 20C, 20D (Open Toe Foot) optional

Hoop: - Midi Hoop – I used this hoop for my Embroidery Library Design

Maxi Hoop – I used this hoop for my ribbon

- Please note that the ribbon will not fit in any hoop smaller than the Maxi Hoop
 - o If you don't have the maxi or midi hoop please contact me before class

Stitch plate: Single hole 0mm (if you have it) or regular 9mm

Other:

Small old towel or drop cloth Air Temporary Marker

Thread snips Tweezers small and large ruler paper scissors Flash drive to load projects rotary cutter

Straight pins small applique scissors

Fabric scissors Your machine manual Paper for taking notes Sewing needles seam ripper press cloth embroidery tape
