Baby 37" x 47"

Lap 52" x 67" and

Twin 70" x 90"

SUPPLY LIST

- Pattern - ***Jewels of The Trade*** by Raija Salomaa of Quilters' Treasure Chest (available at the Old Country Store)
- **Tucker Trimmer 1, Corner Beam and V Block tools by Studio 180 Design** (available at the Old Country Store)
- **Quilter's Magic Wand** or another 1/4" seam guide (available at the Old Country Store)

Basic Sewing and Quilting Supplies -

- Sewing Machine with 1/4" foot, a new needle, power cords and manual (just in case)
- Thread - 50 wt is good for piecing
- Seam ripper
- Scissor snips
- Extra fine pins - Clover Patchwork Extra Fine Pins or Magic Pins - extra fine
- Small cutting mat - 12" x 12" or larger
- Rotary Cutter with a new blade
- Marking pen or pencil - (frixon pen or marking pencil such as Sewline)
- Invisigrip or true grips highly recommended for back of tools

FABRIC REQUIREMENT

Jewels of the Trade

12 Coordinating Fabrics and a Background

Fabric Yardage:

Based on 42" of useable fabric. Please plan accordingly.

Fabric	Baby 37" x 47"	Lap 52" x 67"	Twin 70" x 90"
Background	2 yds	3 yds	4 1/2 yds
12 Coordinating Fabrics (each)	1 FQ *	3/8 yd **	1/2 yd
Binding	3/8 yd	1/2 yd	5/8 yd
Backing	2 1/2 yds	3 3/8 yd	5 1/2 yds

*** FQ - Fat Quarter, **FQs could be used but then there wouldn't be any room for error**

If you prefer to make this quilt very scrappy, just cut the total number of different units needed from various fabrics. High contrast between the background and the coordinating fabrics is highly recommended.

QST - Quarter Square Triangle, **CU** - Combination Unit, **HST** - Half Square Triangle,
CBU - Corner Beam Unit, **VBU** - V Block Unit, **SU** - Square Unit

	G - for HSTs	Cut (24) 3" squares	Cut (24) 4" squares <i>(you may need to use the leftover 4 1/2" strip)</i>	Cut (24) 5" squares
	H - for CBU and VBU	Cut (192) 3" x 2 1/4" rectangles	Cut (192) 4" x 2 3/4" rectangles	Cut (192) 5" x 3 1/4" rectangles
	I - for SU	Cut (12) 2 1/2" squares	Cut (12) 3 1/2" squares	Cut (12) 4 1/2" Squares <i>(you may need to use the leftover 5 1/2" strip)</i>
	Border Strips	Cut (4) 3 3/4" strips	Cut (6-7) 3 3/4" strips	Cut (9) 5 1/4" strips

Getting Organized!!! Separate above fabrics onto paper plates or into ziplock bags and label -

QST - Quarter Square Triangle, **CU** - Combination Unit, **HST** - Half Square Triangle,
CBU - Corner Beam Unit, **VBU** - V Block Unit, **SU** - Square Unit
