

Scrappy Americana Flag Supply List

Pattern: *Scrappy Americana Flag* by Lori Holt

Fabric: See yardage amounts as listed on the back of the pattern booklet. Kits may be available from various vendors on line.

*****Cutting Instructions – please be aware!**

I know you may wish to cut your fabrics ahead of time, but I highly recommend that you wait to cut your fabrics until after I demonstrate the various stitching methods unless you are absolutely certain which method you plan to use; the cutting dimensions listed may need to be revised depending on which method you choose. Also, you may wish to wait to purchase specific rulers until you decide on your method as well!

Basic Sewing Kit

- thread - machine piecing thread in a neutral shade to match your fabrics
- straight pins
- seam ripper
- fabric shears
- thread snips
- fine tip marking pencil or pen (a Frixion pen or a mechanical pencil work nicely)

Sewing Machine in working order. Be sure to also bring:

- 1/4" piecing foot
- Sewing machine needles

Rotary Cutting Tools

- rotary cutter with a fresh blade
- acrylic ruler
- cutting mat

Half Square Triangle Block Supplies

*Note: the pattern recommends using Triangle Paper or Triangles on a Roll as one of the options, but I think you'll be happiest using the Bloc Loc ruler or a traditional square ruler instead.

- ½" marking ruler
- Bloc Loc Rulers
 - 2" or larger
 - 3" or larger
 - 5-1/2" or larger, OR

Cont.

- Traditional Square Rulers
 - 2" or larger
 - 3" or larger
 - 5-1/2" or larger

Flying Geese Block Supplies

*Note: the pattern recommends using Flying Geese Foundation Paper as one of the options, but I think you'll be happiest using the traditional method or the Wing Clipper II Ruler.

- Wing Clipper II ruler (Please note – the Wing Clipper/Wing Clipper I does not allow you to cut the correct size of flying geese units needed for this pattern.)

Square in a Square Block Supplies

*Note: the 5" Square in a Square Foundation Paper is not necessary to stitch this block.

Blue Star Block Supplies

*Note: again, the pattern recommends using Triangle Paper or Triangles on a Roll as one of the options, but I think you'll be happiest using the 2" Bloc Loc ruler or a traditional square ruler instead.
