

# Yes, You Can Embroider: A Sewing Machine Cover Class

## Supply list:

### Digitize Design

- For this class, you may choose **any embroidery design you love**. During class, you'll learn how to add a **simple word or phrase beneath your design** using the lettering fonts built into your machine.
  - I recommend using a design in your machine or if you prefer OESD designs are always great.
    - I used one I found on esty. Those are not always the best designs, but this one stitched out great. [Joyful Stitches - Machine Embroidery Design - Etsy](#)

### Fabric

- 1 to 2 yards of fabric (depending on the size of your machine) for front cover and backing
- 1 yard of batting – I used a Frankenstein strap batting for this project
  - To make my Frankenstein batting I butted up two scrap ends and used the number 2 zig zag stitch to combine the two into 1. If you have questions about this call me.

- (4) pieces of ribbon cut at approximately 6-10 inches long depending on preference

### Stabilizer

- Medium tear away stabilizer – I used OESD – I recommend bringing your roll.

### Thread

- Bring a variety of threads that match the colors of your desired design.
- You will need the thread color of your choice when stitching the cover. After the embroidery is completed. (Black Bobbin case)

**Bobbin Thread:** - Seraline – please have bobbin thread prewound (Yellow bobbin case if you have it. It is not required but recommended)

**Needles:** - Embroidery 80/12 or Microtex 80/14. *I recommend the Microtex 80/14.*

**Embroidery Machine:** – bring all items to make your machine work 😊

**Feet:** - #26 (embroidery foot) , #97 (Patchwork Foot), #50 (Walking Foot optional)

**Hoop:** - Bring the hoop that will fit your machine that goes with the size of your design

- I recommend the large oval
- I used the Maxi as my design was too large for the large oval hoop

**Stitch plate:** Single hole 0mm (if you have it) or regular 9mm

### Other:

Temporary Marker or pencil (I prefer a sewline air marker)

Thread snips	Tweezers
small and large ruler	paper scissors
Flash drive to load projects	rotary cutter
Straight pins	embroidery tape
Fabric scissors	seam ripper
Your machine manual	Press cloth
Paper for taking notes	Compensation tool
Wonder Clips	Point turner
